One of my fondest memories was playing in the 1979 National 8 Ball Tournament in Louisville, Kentucky. Prior to this tournament, Rocky Tillis custom made my cue stick and I have had it in my possession ever since. While at the tournament I played in a special challenge match against Steve Mizerak Jr. I can proudly say that I defeated Steve when he missed his shot on the eight ball and thus allowed me to run the remaining four balls on the table for a victory. Luckily, it was a short one game match.

I am also sending you an old newspaper article from 1990 when my team (Nell's Foxy Four) defeated the Flamingo Ladies for the city championship. On that night we beat them 7 - 0. That was the first time in the history of the league that any team had won without ever losing a match.
